One Great Hour of Sharing **Sunday, March 22nd**

Through One Great Hour of Sharing, lives are literally changed daily.

One Great Hour of Sharing (part of Our Church's Wider Mission) is the special mission offering of the United Church of Christ that carries God's message of love and hope to people in crisis.

60% of the UCC's offering supports our work with international partners to provide sources of clean water, food, education and health care, small business micro-credit, advocacy and resettlement for refugees and displaced persons, and emergency relief and rehabilitation.

The rest of the offering funds disaster preparedness and response, and disaster-related volunteer initiatives in the United States.

In 2018, the OGHS offering was just under \$2 million. An additional \$1.5 million was given to the United Church of Christ Disaster Ministries in support of specific disaster relief efforts. Almost 65% of UCC congregations participate annually.

Children's Closet Announcement!

Spring 2020 Children's Closet and Bake Sale is coming soon! Children's Closet is one of our missions that happens twice yearly, spring and fall. The fall CC also includes the Bake Sale and the Rummage Sale. The money the church receives is donated equally to each of these agencies: Women Aware, Welcome home, CSADV Shelter, Food Bank, Warming Shelter and Mary Treglia.

Please take time to view the signup sheets on the Children's Closet table in the Narthex. There are three different jobs to choose from: cashier, bagger and/or floor walker. The job shifts are each two hours. Please consider volunteering for a shift during one of our church's missions, the Children's Closet and Bake Sale. Thank you!

COVID-19 (Coronavirus)

1. This virus is contagious but, so far, it's not as deadly as other world outbreaks (MERS, SARS, etc.). 80% of people will only have mild cases, if they get it.
2. To stay healthy, follow flu prevention tips (below)
3. Don't panic — start to prepare, instead
4. Be smart about travel
5. **PLEASE stay home if you are sick or have any of these symptoms: fever, cough, sore throat, shortness of breath, headache, stuffy/runny nose, fatigue, muscle aches. This is very important so you don't spread the flu or Covid-19 throughout the congregation.**

When it comes to taking care of ourselves, there are some things we can all think and do:

- Practice basic hygiene. That includes:
 - 20-second hand washing, and wash often. That's a long time and It's as long as singing "Happy Birthday" 2 times through, or "Baby Shark" up through the Daddy Shark verse. Regular soap and water are fine; you do not need to use anti-bacterial soap.
 - Sneeze or cough into your elbow or tissue (then throw the tissue away).
 - Do not touch your face (eyes, nose, mouth).
 - Clean and disinfect surfaces and frequently touched objects – for example, remember to wipe your counters with soap and water.
 - Sanitize your doorknobs at home daily.

- Avoid contact with people who are ill.
- **Stay home if you are feeling in any way ill.**
- Have a supply of easy-to-cook foods and cleaning supplies.
- Have a supply of any prescribed medications.

- At church, we will be:
 - Sanitizing doorknobs daily (that includes bathroom stall latches and faucet handles).
 - Coming up with options for Passing the Peace. We may omit it for now, or use other ways to communicate (touching elbows, bowing, etc.).
 - Planning ways to respond to affected families, and individuals who live alone.
 - Considering how to broadcast worship so people can watch from home if they are ill.
 - Posting CDC posters.
- For Communion, we will be:
 - Making hand sanitizer use visible before serving Communion
 - Having servers give out the Communion bread, so only their hands touch the plate.
 - We may consider only giving out bread for Communion.

Search Committee:

The Search Committee continues to complete the necessary research and writing to prepare the Church Profile. This becomes the central document that is used to announce the opening of the position of Pastor for First Congregational Church. An important part of that work is to provide quality information to candidates about “who we are” as a congregation, and “what characteristics we desire” in a Pastor. Last Sunday we started a process of surveying the congregation and were pleased that everyone in worship spent time providing information that we will tabulate, then use in the profile. Thank you for your willingness to share candidly and in confidence, your perceptions and opinions.

Surveys are a powerful measurement and communication tool. The more people from our congregation that participate, the better the information that comes from the survey. Additional parts of the survey will be a part of our service for several weeks. Because we know that not everyone is available to attend church every Sunday, we are also making the survey available for your completion at home. We ask that you:

- find the survey,
- complete and submit.

The information from your survey will be sent to the church and added to the information provided by many other congregants for use in preparing the church profile.

It is the intent of the committee to have this document near completion by the end of March, so we need to be diligent in completing surveys. Please participate in this important step of the search process.
